Code of Ethics

Organization : New Brunswick Professional Association of Criminology (NBPAC)

Version : 1.0 **Adopted :** June 2, 2026

This code sets out the ethical obligations of every NBPAC member. It is intended to protect the public, preserve trust in the profession and guide the conduct of criminologists.

1. Scope

The code applies to all members, regardless of category, across all professional activities: research, assessment, intervention, teaching and consulting.

2. Integrity and Honesty

- Act with honesty, probity and good faith.
- Take part in no fraud or misrepresentation of qualifications.
- Claim as one's own only work actually performed.

3. Competence and scope of practice

- Practise only within the limits of one's competence, training and experience.
- Keep knowledge current under the Continuing Professional Development Policy.
- Base opinions on evidence and recognized methods.
- Respect the limits of one's scope of practice; perform no act reserved to a regulated profession (social work, psychology, counselling therapy, law, medicine) without holding the title, and refer the person to the competent profession when needed.

4. Confidentiality

- Protect confidential information obtained in the course of duties.
- Disclose it only with consent or where required by law.
- Take reasonable measures to ensure data security.

5. Objectivity and Conflicts of Interest

- Remain objective and impartial.
- Promptly declare any actual, potential or apparent conflict of interest.
- Not misuse one's position for undue advantage.

6. Respect for Human Dignity

- Respect the rights and dignity of every person, without discrimination.
- Refrain from harassment, abuse of power or exploitation.
- Account for cultural, linguistic and social contexts.

7. Accountability to the Public and the Profession

- Place the public interest ahead of personal interest.
- Contribute to the reputation and advancement of the profession.



- Report any serious ethical breach.

8. Service in Both Official Languages

Wherever possible, the member facilitates access to their services in French or English according to the person's choice.

9. Breaches and Measures

Any breach may lead to disciplinary measures under the Complaints-Handling Policy, ranging from a warning to removal.

Commitment: By joining the NBPAC, each member undertakes to respect this code and to promote its principles.
